# Partnering with yourtown since 2013

Lendlease has partnered with yourtown since 2013 when we committed to creating five homes in Lendlease Communities' Yarrabilba estate in SE QLD.

Since then, Lendlease has continued to leverage **yourtown's** expertise in training and employment outcomes for young people and, more recently in their creation of housing for vulnerable people.

#### **FutureSteps Support**

- House in Brisbane 2020 \$100K grant towards the build of a four-bed transitional home for women and children escaping domestic and family violence (DFV).
- Block of units Sydney 2022 \$2M grant towards the purchase and renovation of a block of units, for transitional DFV housing.
- ❖ Apprenticeships in Brisbane 2022 -Creating Positive Futures were the successful recipient of the \$100k of which \$28K was for yourtown to employ 3 school based apprentices on the Yarabilba Qbuild homes.

### **Further Lendlease support**

- 2013-2016 Yarrabilba Social Enterprise: yourtown partnered with Lendlease to construct five homes at Yarrabilba precinct QLD.
- ❖ 2016 San Miguel family residential support service in North Richmond NSW – Community Day volunteering to upgrade buildings and grounds.
- 2018-19 Lot 14 Social Enterprise. yourtown's Social Enterprises delivered landscape maintenance, rubbish and graffiti removal at Lot 14 in Adelaide, under contract to Renewal SA. yourtown provided paid work experience and training for local young people.
- 2017 onwards Community Art Initiatives yourtown has facilitated several community art initiatives within Lendlease residential communities to improve public amenities.
- 2017 NSW Social Procurement Symposium -Lendlease and yourtown hosted a social procurement symposium, attended by business leaders, Government representatives, and officiated by Federal Government Ministers including the Hon Craig Laundy MP.
- ❖ 2022 Lendlease AUSGrads Trivia Night \$24K raised to support the Sydney apartments project.
- 2022 Furniture purchase and assembly with our Martin Place Metro and Macquarie Bank partners.
- 2022 Community Day Garden Makeover at Sydney units.




















#### **FutureSteps Project Outline**

Transitional housing is critical in reducing the number of families at risk of returning to refuge, returning to violent partners, or experiencing homelessness.

FutureSteps Project 1 - House for women and children escaping domestic and family violence - Brisbane 2020

\$100,000 granted to assist in building a four-bed transitional home for women and children escaping domestic and family violence in Queensland. Build cost \$300k.

Built by **yourtown's** Social Enterprises which provides paid work experience and training for 8 to 10 young people experiencing unemployment.

Several fundraising activities raised the difference in construction costs including 'Hike for their Home: Larapinta 2021' and other events, which was supported by Lendlease Australia's Head of Sustainability.

## FutureSteps Project 2 – Block of units for transitional housing – Sydney 2022

Lendlease's One Sydney Harbour (OSH) project brought their \$2M FutureSteps payment forward by two to three years, enabling the project teams to be directly involved with their Social Impact initiatives.

The \$2M (ex GST) contribution enabled **yourtown** to purchase a block of eight units which was transformed into transitional housing for seven families plus one common support space. Extra in-kind and fundraising support included:

- ❖ Making the units a home The Martin Place Metro team and Macquarie Bank raised \$12,500 to fund flatpack furniture for three units. Staff from all organisations assembled the furniture and set up each unit ready for the new families.
- Lendlease AUSGRADS fundraiser The fun trivia evening raising over \$24K.
- ❖ Garden makeover Lendlease folks landscaped the backyard into a beautiful usable space.

The project has been supported by many organisations: Macquarie Bank, Sydney Metro and Minter Ellison as well as many great tradies.
